### Little Oaks Wrap Around Care.

We are very lucky that Little Oaks offer both Breakfast Club and After School Club to support our families.

Breakfast Club runs from 7:45am and costs £6 per session. For children arriving after 8:30am, the cost is £3. Breakfast is provided, giving children a calm and positive start to the school day.

Our After School Club runs from 3:00pm to 6:00pm and costs £6.50 per hour, with a reduced sibling rate of £5.50 per hour. The session includes tea, along with a range of activities in a safe and supportive environment.
