Acomb School uniform

At Acomb First School, we have a school uniform which all children are expected to wear everyday whilst learning. We believe that our uniform is practical, comfortable and easy to maintain and stands out as something our children are proud to wear each and every day as a child of Acomb First School. It also helps to create a sense of community and belonging. Acomb First School prides itself in being inclusive and will endeavour to support every child regardless of their level of need. This uniform has been designed to remove as many barriers as possible for children and their families.

Our aims and objectives

Our policy on school uniform is based on the belief that we:

- Ensure clarity of what can and cannot be worn
- Promotes a sense of pride in our school
- Helps to create a sense of community and belonging towards the school
- Identifies pupils within the school
- Prevents pupils from wearing 'fashion clothes' that could be distracting in class
- Is poverty proofing
- Is practical, smart, and designed with health and safety in mind
- Is considered to be good value for money and inclusive

Our school uniform consists of the following items and these can be purchased from Salto, any supermarket/shop or free uniform can be found at our PTA uniform swap page on Facebook (search for Acomb School Uniform Swap) and at our uniform swap at the end of the academic year in the last week of term:

- Acomb logo school jumper, hoodie or cardigan or plain blue jumper, hoodie or cardigan
- White polo t-shirt
- Grey or black trousers, jogging bottoms, leggings, shorts or skirt, pale blue gingham summer dress.
- For PE – black shorts, white t-shirt, tracksuit and sand shoes or trainers
- Forest School kit (to wear for Forest School on Forest School days) – long sleeved top, long trousers, warm jumper / hoodie. Waterproof coat and suitable footwear. In winter we will ask for hats and gloves and in summer, sun hats and sun cream.
- Children come to school dressed in PE kits on their PE days.
- Children should not wear any form of jewellery other than a watch and small stud earrings. **These must be removed for PE.**

- Children should not wear any form of hair colouring / dye unless given permission by school staff as part of a charity / celebration event. Extreme haircuts or hairstyles are not allowed.
- Children should not wear any forms of makeup or nail varnish to school
- Footwear should be plain, black, flat shoes or trainers.
