Accelerated reader

We have bought into a brilliant system which helps us to accurately assess children's reading (mainly in Chestnut class) and ensure the children are reading the correct book. From this week, the children will all do a Star Reading Assessment which will give the children a scale to choose a book from. They will then go to our beautiful new library and choose a book within their scale that they would like to read. They will bring this book home to read. Once they have completed the book they will have a quiz to complete about the book to check their understanding. The children will come to love the new system and their ability to choose the books they would like to read.
