Arbor

We now have Arbor up and running. Mrs Collingwood has been sensational in her commitment to taking on this new system and solving the different problems we encounter. I don't know what we would do without her! Thank you to those who have been in touch when things have not worked. We are still on a bit of journey and will no doubt encounter other glitches but please do reach out for help if you need it.

Could you please ensure you have completed all of the consent forms which appear in a list on the left of the app. These are vitally important and must be completed for all children. There are a number of people who have not filled these in at the moment.

We have just signed up to a further part of the offer which means payments will be easier from now on (you will be able to pay with Apple Pay and should not have to re enter card details each time). In addition to this we are working on a way to have the meal choices all on Arbor too. Hopefully, this will mean you only have to access one system.

Achievement points

You will also notice on Arbor that you see your child has been given achievement points. These now replace our Class Dojo (again keeping everything in one place for you). When you click into the achievement points you can see the reason your child has received these.
