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Visiting Athlete, Monday 9th March

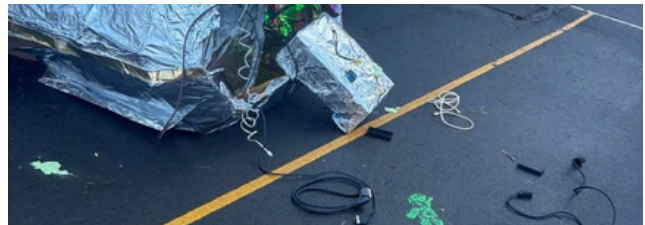
On Monday 9th March, we will be welcoming a visiting athlete into school. The athlete will be announced nearer the time, but we are excited to share that they have competed at a world class level.
